Snowstorm Declaration of Mayor Arthur G. Vigeant

Pursuant to the State of Emergency declared By His Excellency Charles D. Baker, Governor, Mayor Arthur G. Vigeant has further declared that Marlborough City Hall will be CLOSED on Tuesday, January 27th. Further, all city and school afternoon and evening activities scheduled for January 27th are CANCELLED.

Marlborough City Hall will close promptly for business at 5:00 p.m. today, January 26th. In addition, the meetings of the Marlborough City Council and the Planning Board scheduled for are CANCELLED.

All sworn and civilian public safety personnel and vehicles, public works personnel and public works vehicles, including contract personnel supporting public works operations shall remain in full operation and as directed by the Chief of Police, Fire Chief and DPW Commissioner.

Power Outage Information

During an Outage

Do not call 9-1-1 to report your power outage or to ask for information, use 9-1-1 only for emergencies. Call your utility company to report the outage and get restoration information.

After an Outage

1. Be extra cautious if you go outside to inspect for damage after a storm. Downed or hanging electrical wires can be hidden by snowdrifts, trees or debris, and could be live. Never attempt to touch or moved downed lines. Keep children and pets away from them.
2. Do not touch anything near power lines are touching, such as tree branches or fences. Always assume a downed line is a live line. Call your utility company to report any outage-related problem such as downed wires.
3. Throw away any food that has been exposed to temperatures 40° F (4° C) for 2 hours or more or that has an unusual odor, color or texture. When in doubt, throw it out!
