



## Sudbury Reservoir

This 4.5-mile trail stretches along the northern shore of the Sudbury Reservoir between Broadmeadow Road in the east and Framingham Road in the west. This walk takes you through the towering pines by Parmenter Street and across Broad Meadow and Mowry brooks as well as several smaller streams. Enjoy the babbling brooks, the lively fern fields, and the serene water views. Despite its name, no portion of this reservoir lies in Sudbury. This man-made lake is instead named after the Sudbury River which was dammed to form the Reservoir and feeds the lake. This property is owned and managed by the State Department of Conservation and Recreation Division of Water Supply Protection, and is managed as a backup water supply for Marlborough and 101 communities around Boston, therefore no dogs or biking is permitted. Hunting is permitted according to state regulations. The deer hunting season begins in October and runs through December. Dogs are not allowed along this trail segment.
